Literacy

In English this term we will be focusing are learning on the following stories:

Daily Read, Write, Inc. lessons continue for all pupils to develop their early reading and our Grammar work will focus on using capital letters and simple punctuation.

Geography

What is it like here?

This term we wil be learning how to:

Locate three features on an aerial photograph of the school and know the name of the country and village, town or city in which they live. Make a map of the classroom with four key features, using objects to represent the distance and direction of features in the classroom. Recognise four features in the school grounds using a map. Explain how they feel about three areas of the playground and find out how others feel by looking at the results of a survey. Draw a design to improve three areas of the playground using the results from the survey.

White Rose Maths

In Maths lessons this term,

Using the White Rose scheme and Singapore methods, we will focus on the following:

Place Value (within 10) Addition and subtraction (within 10) Geometry (2D and 3D shapes)

Seasonal Changes

Name the four seasons in order and

describe the typical weather in each. Name some activities and events in the four seasons. Describe the appearance of a tree's leaves in each season. Recall that summer has the most daylight hours and winter has the least daylight hours. Record data about the temperature across the four seasons. Label a map of the UK with capital cities and seasonal weather symbols. Complete a pictogram and use it to answer simple questions. Record data about the temperature across the four seasons.



Science

Art and Design

Drawing: Making your mark

Show knowledge of the language and literacy to describe lines. Show control when using string and chalk to draw lines. Experiment with a range of mark-making techniques, responding appropriately to music. Colour neatly and carefully, featuring a range of different media and colours. Apply a range of marks successfully to a drawing. Produce a drawing that displays observational skill, experimenting with a range of lines and mark making.



Design and Technology

Electrical systems

Identify whether a mechanism is a side-to-side slider or an up-and-down slider and determine what movement the mechanism will make. Clearly label drawings to show which parts of their design will move and in which direction. Make a picture that meets the design criteria, with parts that move purposefully as planned. Evaluate the main strengths and weaknesses of their design and suggest alterations.



How did the world begin?

This term the children will be able to:

Say whether or not there is proof that a statement is true. Explain why they believe something to be true. Listen attentively to their partner. Explain how they feel about something they have created. Talk about what is meant by creation. Retell the key parts of the Christian and Jewish creation story. Understand that Christian and Jewish people generally believe the creation story in Genesis explains how the world was created. Talk about what the Hindu creation story might tell some people about God. Make links between the Hindu, Jewish and Christian creation stories studied. Describe what people might think about God. Use art to express their ideas about how the world was created. Explain their ideas verbally or in writing.
